Prior to the amalgamation of the United States Provinces, Sister Mary was the Provincial of the former St. Mary's Province based in Ohio. Most recently, Sister Mary served on Holy Family Province Formation Team. This group's main responsibility is to identify possible candidates to join the Congregation.

In December, 2015 Sister Mary was formally inducted as Provincial along with her Provincial Council, Sisters M. Josita DiVita, Regina Gegic, Almaisa Lopes de Brito and Georgine Golock. In addition to her position as First Councilor, Sister Josita will continue to oversee and promote the St. Joseph Retreat Center. Sister Regina will continue her efforts developing a strong website and social media outreach, as well as, serving as administrator at the St. Joseph Hill Convent. Sister Almaisa plays a pivotal role in developing relationships with the young women living at St. Mary's in New York. Sister Georgine will continue to reside in Akron serving as superior of the community while also as

Provincial Secretary to Sister Mary.

# Additional Trees, Repaired Grotto and New Benches Enhance the Grounds of St. Joseph Hill


This spring there have been a number of changes to the property here on Staten Island.

Mr. William McMahon, a gentleman from Staten Island came to the convent a few years ago to personally deliver a donation to the Sisters after the fire. As he was walking the property he noticed a "few bare spots" that would benefit from the addition of some saplings. Since that initial visit Mr. McMahon and his son have planted upwards of 15 fruit trees here on the Arrochar property. The Sisters are so blessed to have their very own "Johnny Appleseed." During the recovery effort to the old convent the grotto outside the convent was destroyed. This past year through the competent assistance of Kevin Gannon at New Jersey Sand and Gravel Co. the Sisters and students have a lovely new Grotto where they can go for quiet prayer and reflection.




